English	<ul style="list-style-type: none">investigate non-chronological reports and produce their own reports on our history topicexplore the features of information and instructional textsrevise Year 4 grammar terms and focus on fronted adverbials and proof readingexplore the structure of letter writing and write our own formal lettersfocus on using the correct punctuation in our writing.
Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none">convert between different units of measure; estimate, compare and calculate different measures including money in pounds and pencesolve problems involving converting from hours to minutes, minutes to seconds, years to months, weeks to daysSolve problems including co-ordinates, movement and measurement.
Science	<ul style="list-style-type: none">identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibratingrecognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the earfind patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced itfind patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced itrecognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.
