

Recognise, find, name and write one half, one quarter, two quarters, three quarters and one third of a shape and number

Solve addition and subtraction calculations and word problems	
Recall the 2, 5 & 10 times table and use these to solve multiplication and division problems

Suggested homework

Task 1: Wear an analogue watch and practise reading the time - o'clock, half past, quarter past, quarter to (and to the nearest 5 minutes for some children). Watches that have quarter past and quarter to shaded are helpful. Can you tell me when it's dinner time at 5 o'clock? We are leaving for school in 15 minutes, can you tell me when it's half past 8?

Task 2: Research a nocturnal creature (other than owls). What does nocturnal mean? What does your creature eat? Where does it live? Interesting facts. Children are welcome to present their information in a poster or in another creative way and bring it into school to be shared and displayed.
